SELF STUDY REPORT 2023-24

THRUST:

- Outreach and Community Engagement: Engaging with various organizations to collect fees for supporting students reflects the institution's outreach efforts and collaboration with the community.
- Equity and Inclusivity: The institution's focus on promoting fairness and inclusivity by supporting students who may face economic challenges in pursuing higher education.
- Reputation and Branding: Showcasing the institution as an inclusive and socially conscious establishment, enhancing its reputation and attractiveness to potential students and stakeholders.

The thrust of this practice aligns with broader goals of inclusivity, diversity, and social welfare. It reinforces the institution's identity as an agent of positive change in society and its commitment to providing equitable access to education for all, regardless of their background.

The college is associated with the following organizations (Philanthropists) for rewarding/providing scholarships to the students:

1. Anjuman Falah-ul Muslemeen: Its objective is to provide scholarship to those students who are belonging to financially weak section of Muslim community. The maximum amount sanctioned to each student is Rs. 10,000/-.
2. Sima Khatib: Medley Pharma Sima Khatib scholarship is available for students from 10th onwards. Its aim is to provide the scholarship to eliminate illiteracy from society and provide financial assistance to impoverished applicants to complete their higher education. The maximum amount sanctioned by trust is Rs. 10,000/- per student.
3. Lila Poonawalla Foundation: To contribute to the empowerment of Indian women by supporting academically outstanding and financially challenged girls, through Scholarship to pursue higher education and through building skills to pursue respectable employment. To enable socially deprived and financially disadvantaged girls pursue professional degrees, so that they become confident and economically independent, who not only earn for themselves but also take care of their families. The amount sanctioned by this trust is Rs. 45,000/- to each student.
4. Jamiat Islahul Muslemeen: Its objective is to provide scholarship to those students who are belonging to financially weak section of Muslim community.

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There are various Scholarships provided by Government of India and State of Maharashtra, some are enlisted below:

1. Post-Matric Scholarship for SC students: The objective of the scheme is to appreciably increase the Gross Enrolment Ratio of SC students in higher education with a focus on those from the poorest households, by providing financial assistance at post-matriculation or post-secondary stage to enable them to complete their education.
2. Post-Matric Tuition Fee and Examination Fee (Freeship): All types of compulsory fees such as Tuition fees, Exam Fees and other admissible fees are reimbursed to the concern SC category student.
3. Post Matric Scholarship Scheme for ST Students: Applicable to ST students who are pursuing any recognized course from a recognized institution for which qualification is Matriculation/Class X or above.
4. Tuition Fee & Exam Fee for Tribal Students (Freeship): This is state sponsored scheme. Applicant whose parent income limit is more than 2.5 lakhs can apply for the scheme. Only applicants tuition fee and exam fee is reimbursed.
5. Post Matric Scholarship to OBC Students: Tuition Fee and Exam Fee are paid 50% and Maintenance allowance are paid 100% to applicants who's studying in non-government/unaided institutions in professional courses and non-professional courses.
6. Tuition Fees and Examination Fees to OBC Students (Freeship): All types of compulsory fees such as Tuition fees, Exam Fees and other admissible fees are reimbursed to the concern OBC category student.
7. Post Matric Scholarship to SBC Students: Benefits of Tuition Fees, Exam Fees and Maintenance Allowance are paid to only SBC category students.
8. Post Matric Scholarship to SBC Students (Freeship): Benefits of Tuition Fees, Exam Fees and Maintenance Allowance are paid to only SBC category students.
9. Post-Matric Scholarship to VJNT Students: Under this scheme, benefits of Tuition Fees, Exam Fees, and Maintenance Allowance are paid to only VJNT category students
10. Tuition Fees and Examination Fees to VJNT Students (Freeship): All types of compulsory fees such as Tuition fees, Exam Fees and other admissible fees are reimbursed to the concern VJNT category students.

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11. EBC Scholarship: The objective of the Scheme is to provide financial assistance to the Economic Backward Class who is admitted to Diploma / Degree / Postgraduate Professional courses through Centralized Admission Process (CAP).
12. Post-matric scholarship for students belonging to the minority communities: The objective of the scheme is to award scholarships to meritorious students belonging to economically weaker sections of minority community so as to provide those better opportunities for higher education; increase their rate of attainment in higher education and enhance their employability.

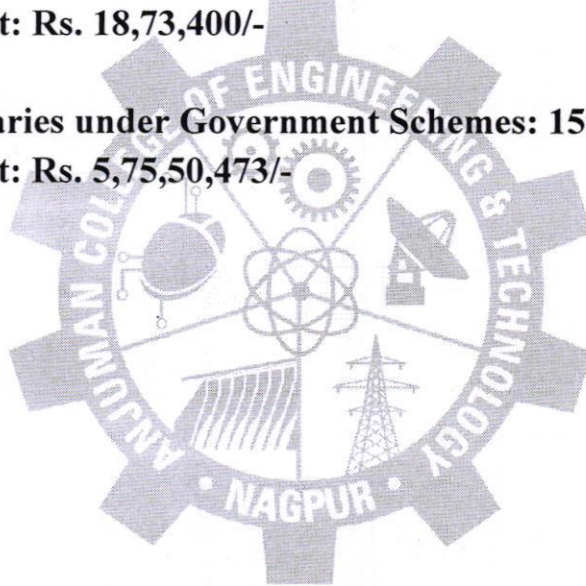


